### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

#### **Are you located on the beach?**

No, Marina Grand Resort is located on the New Buffalo Harbor.

#### **How far away is the beach?**

New Buffalo Beach is a half mile from Marina Grand Resort.

#### **Can you walk to the beach?**

Yes, New Buffalo Beach is just a half mile's walk along the harbor from Marina Grand Resort. Riding our complimentary beach cruisers is also a fun way to get there.

#### **Can you drive to the beach?**

Yes, if you've got a lot of gear, driving is recommended. Parking is available.

#### **How much does it cost to park at the beach?**

During the summer, \$10/day. Parking is always free before 9am and after 8pm as well as during the off-season.

#### **What is Marina Grand Resort's relationship to The Harbor Grand?**

Both hotels are operated by the same management company, Toast Hotel Group.

#### **Do any of your rooms have hot tubs?**

No. The suites have soaking tubs, but the only Jacuzzi is located in the indoor pool area.

#### **Are any of the complimentary beach cruisers kid-sized?**

No, all the bikes are adult-sized. Kids' bikes may be rented nearby at Outpost Sports.

#### **When are the u-pick fruit farms open?**

Blueberries, peaches and nectarines in July and August, apples and pears in August, September and October.

#### **Is there a taxi or shuttle service?**

Complimentary shuttle service is available to and from Four Winds Casino and the Amtrak platform. There is no taxi service in New Buffalo.

#### **Are the rooms and suites at Marina Grand Resort timeshares?**

No, Marina Grand Resort is a condo-hotel. It operates exactly as a hotel does, with one exception. Individual condo-hotel units are available for purchase. For more information about condo-hotel ownership, please visit the Ownership section of our website.
